Rev Iain MacLeod - Who Am I?

I was ordained as an Ordained Local Minister (OLM) in 2012 to a post at Renfield St. Stephens, after having done a twelve month probationary placement there, and I remained there for five years.

Since then I have been in two locum placements, at Clincarthill Parish Church over at Hampden, and at Baillieston St. Andrews in the East End of Glasgow. It was my involvement as a locum however that influenced my decision to move from OLM to full time ministry, so for the last fifteen months I have been completing a probationary placement at Cadder Church in Bishopbriggs, and I am currently exploring a couple of opportunities up North as I seek to determine God's will for my future ministry.

My background is in financial services and for a time I ran my own sales and marketing consultancy. Up until the end of July 2018 I was a Director of Human Resources at The Faith Mission, a Christian missionary organisation working in the rural areas of Great Britain and Ireland. It may be better known to you for its chain of twenty bookshops in Scotland and Northern Ireland, as the one in Bothwell Street in Glasgow, was formally a Wesley Owen bookshop. has a Bible College which trains students for evangelistic ministry and employs over one hundred and twenty staff and around seventy rural evangelists. I am married to Mary, who incidentally is the manager of the FM Bookshop on Bothwell Street, and we live just up the road from the church in Jordanhill. We have no children, but we have a cat that adopted us as a stray a number of years ago and he continues to eat us out of house and homel/

I was brought up in Clydebank, my father worked in Singers, the sewing machine manufacturer. He and my mother both came from the Village of Ness on the Isle of Lewis, in the Outer Hebrides. A few years ago we refurbished the old family home in Ness and we spend most of our holidays there.

Over the next few months I will be working with you as your Interim Moderator and Locum and I look forward to getting to know you all. I am not so good with names so I may need to keep asking for yours until I get more familiar with everyone.

I look forward to journeying with you over the next few months and I pray for God's richest blessing on you all.

As this is our main **Fund Raiser**, please come along and support and enjoy the friendship over a cup of tea / coffee and cakes.




